

## **SHORT REPORT OF ACTIVITIES: 2022-2023**

Started in the year 1920 and affiliated to the Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math in 1927, the Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Society conducted the following activities during the year 2022-2023.

1. In the shrine attached to the monastery, daily worship of Bhagwan Sri Ramakrishna Deva, Holy Mother Sri Sarada Devi and Swami Vivekananda was performed.
2. After the evening Aratrikam readings from the lives of Sri Ramakrishna, Holy Mother and Swamiji, and also from Sri Sri Ramakrishna Kathamrita in Bengali and Hindi were held on all days in a week.
3. On every Ekadashi day, Ramanama Sankirtanam and on Purnima Tithi Shyamnam Sankirtanam were sung after the evening aratrikam.
4. All the major festivals, viz., birthday celebrations of Bhagwan Sri Ramakrishna Paramahansa Deva, Sri Sarada Devi and Swami Vivekananda, Shiva-ratri, Sri Sri Durga Puja, Sri Sri Kali Puja, Sri Sri Saraswati Puja, Christmas Eve, Buddha Purnima were observed with due solemnity and were attended by a large number of devotees.
5. Bhagawan Sri Ramakrishna Deva's Birthday was celebrated with special puja and Chandi Path on 21st February 2023, the Birthday Tithi of Sri Ramakrishna.
6. During the birth anniversaries of the direct disciples of Sri Ramakrishna, portions from their lives and teachings were read in the prayer hall after the evening Aratrikam.
7. Sri Sri Durga Puja was celebrated in image with due solemnity from 1st October 2022. Cooked Prasad was served to over 10,000 devotees who attended the Durga Puja.
8. Sri Sri Kali Puja was celebrated with due solemnity in image the Society premises on 24th October 2022 and Mahashiva Ratri was observed with special worship on 18th February 2023. Besides, Saraswati Puja in images was performed in all of our schools on 26th January 2023.

## **CULTURAL ACTIVITIES**

1. A Library and Reading Room with 8023 books.
2. 16 School Libraries with 76599 books.
3. Singing of inspiring patriotic songs and speeches were organised in each of our schools by the students on Independence Day and Republic Day Celebrations.
4. National Youth Day was celebrated on 12 January 2023 by all the 16 schools under the Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Society, Jamshedpur.

## **EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES**

The Society started its educational activities in early 1920s with just one school. Presently there are 16 schools run by the Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Society, Jamshedpur and it stands out as one of the big educational institutions of the entire Ramakrishna Mission.

The schools are making steady progress and attaining popularity due to sustained efforts of the teaching staff and the honorary workers. The schools and other educational activities run by the Ramakrishna Mission in Jamshedpur are as follows:

**A. HIGH SCHOOLS :** These are Hindi medium schools from Standard VII to X affiliated to Jharkhand Academic Council (JAC). We have the following High Schools in Jamshedpur:

1. **Vivekananda High School, Chenab Road :** Started in 1945, it was recognized in 1948 as a High School by the Board Secondary Education, Bihar. Only boys are admitted to this school. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 373.
2. **Saradmoni Girls' High School, Sakchi :** Started in 1951, it was recognized by the Board of Secondary Education, Bihar in 1954. This school is exclusively for girls. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 645.
3. **Sri Ramkrishna High School, Bistupur :** Started in 1949, it was recognized as a High School in 1953 by the Board of Secondary Education, Bihar. This school admits only boys. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 332.
4. **Sister Nivedita Girls' High School, Burmamines :** Started in 1951, it was recognized by the Board of Secondary Education, Bihar, in the same year. This is another High School for girls. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 691.
5. **Ramakrishna Mission Lady Indra Singh High School, Indranagar :** Started in 1958, this is a school for boys and girls in separate shifts. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 689.

**B. MIDDLE SCHOOLS :**

MIDDLE SCHOOLS: These are Hindi medium schools from Kindergarten to Standard VI affiliated to Jharkhand Academic Council (JAC). We have the following Middle Schools in Jamshedpur:

6. **Vivekananda Middle School, Bistupur :** A free night school for Harijans started in 1921, was developed into a Middle School in 1947 and was recognized in that year by the Department of Education, Bihar. Both boys and girls study in this school. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 470.

7. **Vivekananda Middle School, Chenab Road, Sakchi** : Started as a Primary School in 1936, it was upgraded to Middle School and was recognized by the Department of Education, Bihar in 1944. Both boys and girls are studying in the school. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 842.
8. **Vivekananda Middle School, Sidhgora** : Started in 1951 as an upper Primary School, it was upgraded to the status of Middle School in 1952. The Department of Education, Bihar, in the same year recognized it. This school admits boys and girls from Kindergarten to standard VIII. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 491.
9. **Ramakrishna Mission Lady Indra Singh Middle School, Indranagar** : Started in 1957, this is a school with Hindi and Bengali medium classes for boys and girls in separate shifts. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 651.

**C. UPPER PRIMARY SCHOOL :**

10. **Vivekananda U.P. School, Bhuiyadih** : Started in 1922 as a lower Primary School for Harijan students, the School was upgraded to Upper Primary School and was recognized by the Education Department, Bihar in 1951. Both boys and girls are studying in the school from kindergarten to Standard V. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 147.

**D. ENGLISH MEDIUM SCHOOLS:**

11. **Ramakrishna Mission English School, Sidhgora** : Started in 1979, it was affiliated to C.B.S.E. as a Secondary School in the year 1987; it was subsequently affiliated to I.C.S.E. Board in 2003 as a Secondary School, and was upgraded as a Higher Secondary School and affiliated to the C.I.S.C.E. Board, New Delhi in the year 2008. Both boys and girls are studying in the School up to Class XII. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 2360.

The following 5 English Medium Schools under I.C.S.E. Board were started in the year 1993 :

12. **Ramakrishna Mission English School, Bistupur** : Started in 1993, this is a co-educational English Medium School from Nursery to Class X; it was affiliated to I.C.S.E., New Delhi in the year 2003. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 2040.
13. **Sister Nivedita English High School, Burmamines** : Started in 1993, this is a co-educational English Medium School from Nursery to Class X; it was affiliated to I.C.S.E., New Delhi in

the year 2003. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 1091.

- 14. Vivekananda English High School, Chenab Road, Sakchi :** Started in 1993, this is a co-educational English Medium School from Nursery to Class X; it was affiliated to I.C.S.E., New Delhi in the year 1999. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 671.

Inauguration of a New School Building for Vivekananda English High School, Chenab Road, Sakchi.

A new School Building for 1200 Tribal & Underprivileged boys and girls was inaugurated by Sri Ajay Kumar, Director (Personnel) & Chairman, CSR Committee of Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL), New Delhi on Friday, the 12th August 2022 at the precincts of Vivekananda English High School, Chenab Road, Sakchi, Jamshedpur. The Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL), a Government of India Enterprise, contributed a sum of Rs. 6.13 crores for construction of the School Building and little more than 2.5 crores was spent from the Mission's fund. Srimat Swami Tattwavidanandaji Maharaj, Assistant General Secretary, Ramakrishna Math & Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math was present on behalf of Head Quarters of Ramakrishna Math & Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math. Top officials of RVNL, viz, Sri Ajay Kumar Director (Personnel) & Chairman of CSR Committee, Sri Shankar Paul, Senior DGM/HR, RVNL, Kolkata, Sri Anil Mahato, Coordinator of CSR Committee, RVNL, New Delhi, Sri Vijay Kumar, Chief Project Manager, RVNL, Kharagpur Division, Sri Lalitesh Kumar, DGM, RVNL, Tatanagar were present on the occasion. About 300 people were present in the function. Swami Amritarupananda, Secretary of Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Society, Jamshedpur delivered the welcome address. Revered Swami Tattwavidananda ji Maharaj delivered his message on this occasion. Sri Anil Kumar Mahato also spoke. Sri Ajay Kumar, the Chief Guest of the function, delivered a speech in the capacity of the chief guest. Bhajan "Suswagatam" & "Murtamaheshwaram" and one Patriotic Song "Ham Sab Bhartiya Hai" were presented by the students of Vivekananda English High School, Chenab Road, Sakchi, Jamshedpur.

- 15. Saradmoni English School, Sakchi :** Started in 1993, this is a co-educational English Medium School from Nursery to Std. VIII, proposed to be affiliated to I.C.S.E., New Delhi. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 309.

- 16. Ramakrishna Mission Lady Indra Singh English School, Indranagar :** This is a co-educational English Medium School from Nursery to Class X; it was affiliated to I.C.S.E., New Delhi in the year 2016. During the year 2022-2023 the Roll Strength was 535.

- E. Non-formal School :** One free Non-formal coaching school is being run at Adityapur, in the outskirts of Jamshedpur, for children of Leprosy patients and other slum dwellers. The Roll strength during the year was 193.
- F. One Students' Home at Sakchi** (Phone No. 07277780707) is being run since 1925 exclusively for boys belonging to Backward, Harijan and Tribal communities of rural areas. During the year 2022-2023 in the Hostel there were 118 boys out of which 65 boys from Tribal Community were maintained free of cost in all respects viz., boarding, educational expenses, medical treatment etc.,

### MEDICAL ACTIVITIES

1. Free Medical Treatment is provided through our Mobile Medical Unit in the slum and interior areas of Kandra, Kuluptanga, and Kudada.
2. Nine Free Eye camps for Cataract Operation were organised during the year in collaboration with Purnima Netralaya, Jamshedpur. Intra-ocular lens (IOL) surgeries were performed 294 patients and they were given spectacles free of cost. Each patient was given one woollen blanket.
3. A Blood Donation Camp was organized in the Ashrama premises on National Youth Day, the 12 January 2023 in which 139 people donated blood voluntarily for this noble cause.

4. Under the Pallimangal activities 3 charitable Homeopathic Dispensaries are run in the remote villages of East Singhbhum district viz., Paharpur, Boram, Metyala. Clinics are held three days a week at Paharpur, Boram, Metyala. During the year 2022-2023, 6091 patients were treated through these dispensaries.

### **VOCATIONAL TRAINING**

1. A Typewriting Institute is run to teach Typewriting in English and Hindi free of cost to Tribal boys - 2 and Tribal girls 25.
2. A one year Advanced Computer Course is conducted free of cost for the Tribal boys and girls. During the year 6 students of which 2 boys and 4 girls were trained at the Computer Centre.

### **WELFARE & RELIEF ACTIVITIES**

1. On 26th February 2023 Narayana Seva was conducted in the slum areas of Adityapur as a part of Sri Ramakrishna Birth Anniversary Celebrations. On this occasion, about 1400 poor people, and slum dwellers, were fed sumptuously.
2. **Scholarships** : Rs. 8,09,334.70/- was distributed among the needy students as scholarships. Infosys Foundation Scholarship Rs.82,65,000 was distributed among 551 Students.
3. Pecuniary help was given to poor and meritorious students on a regular basis in order to help them continue their studies. An amount of Rs.6,30,057/- was disbursed from the Students' Welfare Fund to meet the Schools Fees of students studying in our 16 schools.
